






★ DOUGLAS B-19 Heavy Bomber



★ With a wing span greater than the height of a 17-story building the new Douglas B-19 carries a bomb load of 18 tons and can fly nonstop one third of the way around the world. This is the biggest airplane ever constructed in any country. Fully loaded it weighs 82 tons. Its wing spread is 212 feet, and its height nearly 43 feet. Length overall is 132 feet, weight empty 83,253 pounds. Top speed, according to figures released by the

manufacturer, is in excess of 210 miles per hour, cruising speed 186 miles per hour, landing speed 69 miles per hour. Range is 7,700 miles, service ceiling 22,000 feet, fuel capacity 11,000 gallons, and it is manned by a crew of ten men. The B-19 could fly from New York to Paris with a full bomb load and return without stopping. It is, indeed, a super-dreadnought of the air. Construction required nearly four years.




